Compound Verbs

Compound verbs are two or more verbs joined with the conjunctions *and*, *or*, *but*.

Compound verbs tell what the subject of the sentence is doing.

Examples:

The girl skipped and ran. "Skipped" and "ran" tells what the girl did.

The boys swam and splashed. "Swam" and "splashed" tells what the boys did.
